President's Report 1990 \ 1991

It is with pleasure that I present my Report for 1990\1991. The 1990 ski season was excellent in terms of snow cover and at one stage we had a snow drift at the southern end of the lodge, about 15 feet deep. The good snow conditions helped to extend the season, but this was not reflected in substantially increased accommodation income for the Club. Indeed there were weekends early in the season when the lodge was under utilised, so perhaps the recession has also affected us.

Ro Moore will present her Treasurers's Report shortly, which will provide accurate details, but in the meantime I can indicate that the accommodation income was about \$41,000 up on last year by about \$3300. I would like to take this opportunity to thank Ro, (and Russell Curwood for his assistance) on your behalf for her fine job as the Club's Treasurer.

For some time it has been of concern that the entrance to the Lodge should be improved for both safety and aesthetic reasons and the heavy snow last year emphasised the need for improvement. Consequently, construction has commenced on a verandah at the southern end of the building which should greatly enhance the buildings access and appearance, as it will also entail removal of all the old flues from the external wall.

It is also hoped that we will be able to construct mezzanine floors in both flats to accommodate the double beds, which will give much better use of the floor areas of the flats.

Prior to this season, we should have, installed, a smoke detection\alarm system, and this is being investigated at the moment.

Jim Milledge's architectural efforts on these projects are worthy of special thanks.

There will probably not be other major works carried out this summer except for general ongoing maintenance. This will require some work party input by members so I would ask you to contact a Committee member to establish an appropriate time to attend.

As the building is now of an age where maintenance is becoming increasingly important, the Club will find that we will be faced with considerable expenditure in future years to keep the building up to standard. As you know, it has been proposed that a maintenance levy be introduced to assist with this upkeep, and this matter will be discussed in greater detail during General Business.
